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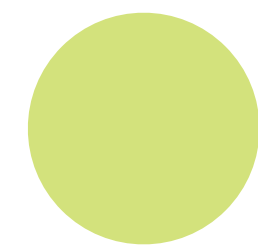

What if that same resource could help thousands of learners worldwide, inspire other educators, and amplify your professional impact?



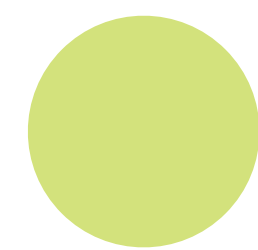
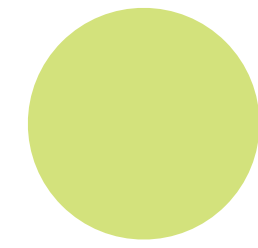

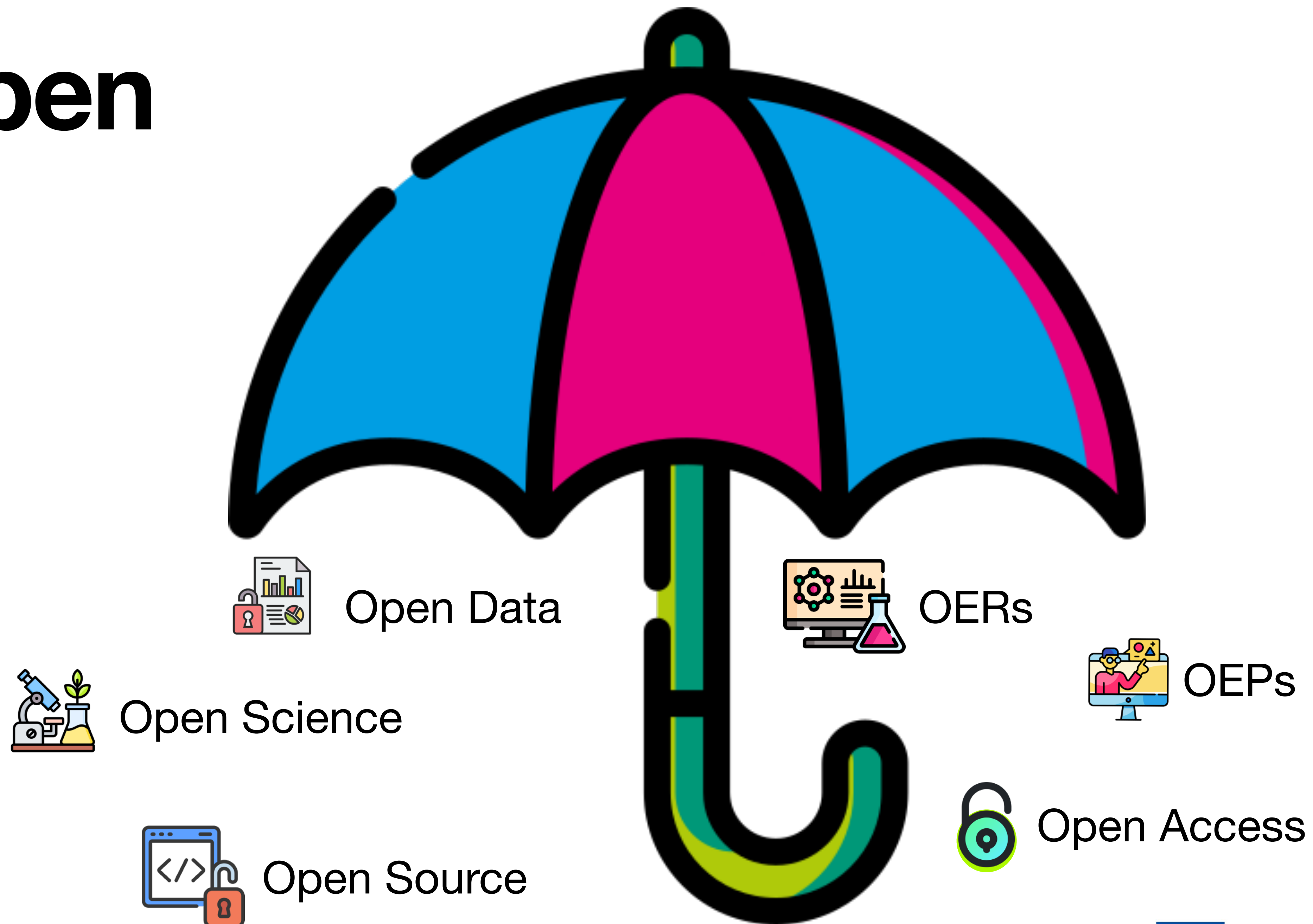
What are OERs?



Open Educational Resources (OERs) are free educational materials like textbooks, videos, and courses that are released under open licenses such as Creative Commons, allowing anyone to legally use, share, adapt, and redistribute them for teaching and learning purposes.

What is an Repository for OERs?

- platform that stores and provides free access to educational materials such as textbooks, course content, research papers, and multimedia resources.



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- searchable databases where educators, students, and learners can discover quality educational resources



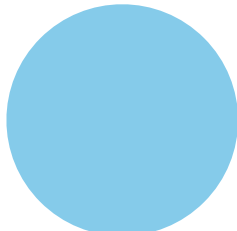
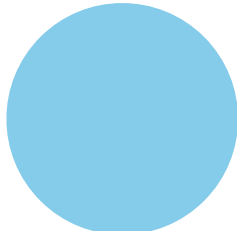
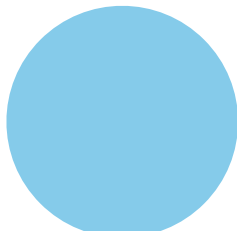
